

BLUE PATAGONIA

Day 1: Private transfer from the Punta Arenas Airport (3 hrs.) - We will meet and check the program with the Guides - Night at the hotel in Puerto Natales.

Day 2: Private transfer from Puerto Natales to Torres Del Paine via Laguna Amarga, our Guides and Assistants will set the Base Campsite at Las Torres Camping, a quiet place with a beautiful view of Almirante Nieto Hill and North and Central Towers. This first trekking goes up to the Base of the Towers during the day (7 hrs.), about 650 Mts. It is a privilege place with an amazing view of the East Sides of the Towers. Night at the Camp - Dinner and breakfast at the Refuge.

Day 3: After breakfast, clear the camp and we are only (5 hrs.) to the Seron Camp. It is an easy calm walk that cross a very nice daisy prairie, Seron is a relaxing and historical place. Night at the Camp - Dinner and breakfast at Seron.

Day 4: Early breakfast, then we will walk towards Dickson Refuge; Dickson Glacier is one of the glaciers at the south extreme of the Continental Patagonian Ice Field. This is a beautiful path surrounding Paine Lake, notros trees, foxes and mountains. Approximately (7 hrs.) of activity. Night at the Camp - Dinner and breakfast at the Refuge.

Day 5: Spectacular day where we will go through one of the purest valleys and forests in Torres Del Paine: "Los Perros" Valley, with big Lengas trees. This is a residence place of the Red Head Magellan Woodpecker. It is from (6/7 hrs.) of activity. Before we will get to the camp we have the possibility to appreciate "Los Perros" Glacier and its small lagoon and floating icebergs. Night at the "Los Perros" Camp - Dinner and breakfast prepared by our staff.

Day 6: The longest day, but with the best view of the Patagonian Ice Field. After John Gardner's passage (1.350 Mts.) we will see Grey Glacier and its 27 kms, a real ice highway, mountains, ice heights in front of us, it's Centinelas Hills. The descent is among little coigue trees, up to Paso Camp. The next hours we will go through extensive native forests: lengas, coigues, notros and other species endemic in our park. Getting to Grey Refuge will take us about (10/12 hrs.) Night at the Camp - dinner and breakfast at the Refuge.

Day 7: Resting and a good breakfast in the morning. In the afternoon there is the possibility to take a walk on Grey Glacier (Ice Hiking). Here expert guides with all the safety equipment will pick you up on a zodiac on Grey Lake to a security speech about walking on the glacier, visiting cracks and climbing some of the glacier walls (helped by the guides). Night at the Grey Camp - Dinner and Breakfast at the Refuge.

Day 8: Keeping on the trekking, surrounding Grey Lake, many icebergs floating on the shore are carried by the wind. This path has several viewpoints to the Grey Glacier; notros and Lengas trees are our loyal partners. It takes (4 hrs.) to the Paine Grande Lodge, a good place to rest. Getting closer to the base of Paine Horns. We will be surround Scottberg Lake for (2 hrs.), a smooth path with many notros trees up to French River and Italian Camp- Night at the Camp – Dinner and Breakfast prepared by our staff.

Day 9: Day walk to French Valley, the assistants set the campsite in Los Cuernos Refuge. While we going up to British Camp (2.5hrs.), here we will see the French Glacier and its constant avalanches and we will arrive to the French viewpoint, Mascara, Hoja, Espada, Catedral and other Mountains surround us and create a great granite gallery. Trek to Los Cuernos (5 hrs.). Night at the Camp – Dinner and Breakfast at the Refuge.

Day 10: Our last day of trekking, we will stop in the base of Paine Horns and Almirante Nieto Hill, a beautiful path that surrounds Nordensjold and Inges Lagoon, it is place to see condors and a lot of flora, (4 hrs.) quiet trek and we arrive to Las Torres Hostería. Private transfer to Puerto Natales - Night at the Hotel.
