

A VIEW OF TWO NATIONAL PARKS

Day 1: Private Transfer to Las Torres Hostería – Trekking to the Seron Camp (4 hrs.) going through the famous Daisy Prairie. Tent night, meals prepared by the guides.

Day 2: Trekking of approximation to Mameluko Passage (6 hrs.), where there is a view of the east side of the park: Blue Lagoon , Onion Lagoon, Baguales Mountain Range and the Patagonian Pampas – Night at the High Camp, meals prepared by the guides.

Day 3 : This day we will go through the “Mameluko” Passage, here the Silence Valley give us a great view of Dickson Glacier and the Mountains of the Continental Ice Field, the west side of Torres del Paine and two of the greatest mountains in the park, Escudo and Fortaleza Hill (8 hrs.). Night at Japanese Camp, meals prepared by the guides.

Day 4: After a good breakfast and to clear the camp we will walk to the “Las Torres” Campsite (1 hr.), from here we visit the viewpoint of the Towers (2 hrs.) and then down the valley to Las Torres Hostería (2 hrs.) A private transfer with the kayaks and equipment takes us to the Serrano Camping. This is an ideal place to rest and recover energy, besides it has an excellent view of the whole Paine Mountain Range. Night and meals prepared by the guides.

Day 5: Our guides give us an instruction about kayaking, direction and security. We will row constantly with the Paine Mountain Range behind our back (2 hrs). With a special maneuver we will evade the Serrano waterfall. If the weather allows we will row to the mouth of Tyndall River, navigating constantly with an excellent view of the Paine Mountain Range (4 hrs). Night at the “Río Tyndall” Camp - Meals prepared by the guides.

Day 6: After an excellent breakfast we will row up Tyndall River to get to Tyndall Lake, about 4kms. We will have the possibility to get closer to the Tyndall Glacier or stop in a small cove to walk and get another perspective of the glacier. This is an excellent place to have lunch. Back along the Tyndall River and reaching Serrano River up to the “Pekín Guerrero” Ranch (4 Hrs.) Night at the Ranch – Meals provided by the guides.

Day 7: After to say goodbye to Mr. Pekín, we will row down River Serrano (3 hrs.) observed by lenga and cypress forests, getting closer to Balmaceda hill and the marvelous sight of Serrano Glacier up to the mouth of River Serrano and the last few miles aver the “Última Esperanza” Fjord towards Puerto Toro- Visit to Serrano Glacier - Connection with the boat back to Puerto Natales city through the “Última Esperanza” Fjord – Arrival to Puerto Natales city – END OF THE PROGRAM.
